



Ambulance officers provide pre-hospital emergency care and treatment for anyone requiring medical assistance.

Some of the things you might do as an Ambulance officer include:

- provide medical assistance to those who are involved in accidents
- attend any events where accidents or other health emergencies
- transport patients to hospital
- drive ambulances to sites of emergencies
- prepare written reports on injuries and the treatment provided
- provide transport for patients from home to hospital and return
- keep equipment in good working order
- work closely with other emergency services including police, firefighters, doctors and nurses

You will need to have:

- excellent health and fitness
- good thinking skills and the ability to act quickly
- able to work in stressful situations
- good people skills
- good written communication skills
- drivers license

Education & Training

You usually need to have completed year 12 with good passes in English and Mathematics and upon successful application you will receive both on-the-job training and a qualification that might include a diploma or bachelor of paramedic (health) studies.
